Ground Guide

The new ground was officially opened on 5 August 2016. When they moved four miles from their old ground which was a surprise after they had turned their old ground from a field into a National League ground but the club aspire to get to the Football League.



They sold off part of the stands and seats to local football and hockey clubs, The thing that strikes you about the new Mill Farm Stadium, it certainly has not been built 'on the cheap.'



Although currently with structures only on three sides, with the North End just having a small open flat standing area, there is plenty of space at that end for future expansion. The stadium is dominated on one side by the large Main Stand, which towers over the rest of the stadium. With a capacity of 2,000 seats, housed within a single tier, the stand is covered by a large roof, which is semi-circular in appearance. The roof is placed quite high above the seating area, as above the seating section, there are two floors fronted by large glass windows. These areas are surrounded by black cladding, whilst further above there is a large clock, flanked in large white lettering; spelling out AFC Fylde.

Opposite is a small covered terrace, which runs the full length of the pitch. In keeping with the design of the Main Stand, it also has a curved roof. What is most striking feature of this side are the four large curved floodlight pylons that extend from behind the stand over the roof. These are quite unusual seemed to resemble a wave in outline. The remaining end is a fair sized covered terrace that like the rest of the ground is free any supporting pillars meaning that you can get a good view of the playing action.

Most fans are housed in the South Stand but are given Block A in the Main Stand if the support is big and have electronic ticket gates with food in the ground

Driving to the Ground



Leave the M55 at Junction 3 and take the A585 towards Kirkham. After one mile you will reach the Mill Farm Stadium on your right. The entrance to the complex is just off the roundabout by the Aldi store. There is a fair sized car park at the stadium itself. Don't be tempted to park in the nearby Aldi Store as parking restrictions during the day if full go down past the cemetery and park on Mowbeck Way.

Take Northern trains to **Kirkham & Wesham Railway Station** and then walk 800 yards to the ground straight up Fleetwood Road and when you get to the roundabout go straight on past Aldi and the ground is on the left or take the **Preston Bus 76** from outside the station which drops you outside the ground.



Ground Guide

This replaced the Bucks Head ground on the same site which had been home to Wellington Town and Telford United for over a century. The Bucks Head it was in desperate need of renovation. The terraces were a mixture of concrete steps and cinder banking, one of the stands was built from wood and the toilet facilities left a lot to be desired



It was built in stages beginning in 2000, with the works being completed in 2003. It's a more modern ground compared to the Bucks Head that it replaced with good facilities, including a hotel which is attached to the stadium.

There are four good stands On one side of the ground sits the Sir Stephen Roberts Stand, this single tiered, all seated stand, has a capacity of 2,200. It is smart looking and has executive boxes to its rear. Both ends are covered terraces that are of similar design, both having semi-circular roofs.

The Frank Naginton Stand is given to away supporters. On the remaining side of the ground, is an open terrace, called the Jack Bentley Terrace which is dominated behind by the Club offices. To one side of this open terrace towards the away end is a small electric scoreboard.

Driving to the Ground



From the North

Leave the M6 at Junction 15 take slip road left to A500 towards Stone / Eccleshall / Stoke on Trent then at the roundabout take third exit on to A519 / Newcastle Road after about four mile at the roundabout, take second exit and then at then after 14 miles at the roundabout, take first exit on to A41.

Then at the next roundabout carry straight on and the next take the second exit down the A518 and go straight on through 6 roundabouts at the next at Queensway Turn left on to A442/Trench Lock, and then immediately bear left on to Trench Lock at the next roundabout take the first exit into Castle Street at the Y junction go left down Haybridge Road and at the next roundabout go straight on (which is the second on the left) after crossing the railway bridge take the first on the right then first left into the car park at the ground.



From the South

Leave the M6 at Junction 10A M54 towards North (& MID) Wales/ Telford/ Wolverhampton and leave the M54 at Junction 6 and take the third exit on the roundabout Whitechurch Drive (A5223 Telford West/Whitchurch/Hospital). Go past Tesco Extra on your left and then at the second roundabout take first left Bennets Bank and at the College turn right up Haybridge Road the entrance to the club car park is a short way down this road on your left. It costs £3 per car to park there

Trains to **Wellington (Shropshire) Railway Station** by Arriva Wales, at the station you can catch a **4, 11 & 55 Arriva buses** from the nearby Wellington Bus Station which is left as you come out of the station to David Street walk back to the cross then turn right into Holyhead Road then cross the road and then first left into Regent street and then first right into Withering Close the ground is in front of you.

If you are arriving by train, at Wellington Railway Station then the first pub you should call at is the William Withering, which is located 43-45 New Street on the Parade and is in the good beer guide but get better food at the Swan and if you wish a choice of beer The Cock Hotel gives you the best selection.

There is the Dugout bar, which also shows Sky Sports, which is located in the Whitehouse Hotel which is adjacent to the stadium go around behind the Main Stand and you will see the hotel bar

Otherwise the nearest pub is the Cock Hotel at 147 Holyhead Road which is an Old Coaching Inn and is a regular in the CAMRA Good Beer Guide and has eight hand pumps, 2 bars "The Old Wrekin Tap" and the "Brassiere De Haan" Belgian beer bar. They pride themselves on providing the best quality Real Ale and beers from around the UK and Belgium. They have 8 traditional Angram hand pulls with Real ales changing on a daily basis; you will always find one that suits your taste.

The Swan Hotel, which is around a five minutes walk away from the stadium at Watling Street Wellington, also features a Carvery and run by Chris and Barbara a friendly service large choice of starters and then on to the main course, large choice of vegetables and choice of 3 meats, which turned out to melt in your mouth and the beer is good with a large choice of beers

Straight on at next roundabout, taking the lefthand lane, and turn left at traffic lights into Bridge Street, turn first right into Station Approach. At station forecourt and car park, take narrow single-track road on extreme right and follow to Stadium.

A small ground that does have a bit of character for 3,600 people but seems to have a disproportionate amount of seating for its size with 1,500 seats of which about a 1000 are under cover. On one side is the small Main Stand that runs for about a third the length of the pitch. There are spaces for standing spectators on either side of this stand on this side of the

pitch. Opposite the stand is a similar looking covered all seated Tom McRoy stand, this around twice the size in terms of length. One end, the Bentley Close End is a small 500 seated area that is open to the elements this end was a former terrace that has had seats bolted onto to it.



Opposite is a small steep terrace, known as the 'Tin End'. This has a small covered area at the back towards the centre and is used by the away fans. The ground is smartly painted red and surrounded by trees giving it a really nice rural feel when the sun is shining. The Reds Bar in the ground is very popular on matchdays.



Driving to the Ground



From the M1 turn off at junction 28 from the South first exit from the North third exit at the roundabout onto the A38 towards Derby and then follow the road for two-miles then take the slip road onto the B600 at then end of the slip road turn right on to Nottingham Road at head towards the town centre.

After half-a-mile, immediately after Kings Christ Catholic Church on left, take the first left into North Street. The ground is 150-yards down on the right. The parking is on the local streets

From the North take the train to **Alfreton Railway Station** and it's a 14 mins or ½ mile walk to the ground, when you come out of the station walk up the slip road on to Salcombe Road cross the road and the junction turn onto Mansfield Road. Then walk all the way down to the Station Bar there cross the road passed **Jimmie's Fish Bar** (Get fish and Chips on the way back) then walk down Prospect Street to the end then cross the road at the lights and the first left into North Street after Kings Christ Catholic Church and left across the car park the ground is right in front of you or get the buses **332, 333, 245, 247** to Nottingham Road at after Kings Christ Catholic Church on left, then its left down North Road to the ground.

Driving to the Ground

North

Take the A1 to just past Burgham Golf Club then take a left for Chevington Moor and at Moor crossroads take a right for Morpeth (B1337) and go through Widdington and at the roundabout take the second exit on to the A1068.



Then at the next roundabout take the first exit onto the A189 and at the next roundabout take the second exit and go straight on at the next two roundabouts and just after crossing the river Blyth take the exit for A193 Blyth and Bedlington and at the roundabout take the first exit onto Cowpen Road and follow the road past Asda and the retail park to Broadway Roundabout there take the second exit and go straight on at the next roundabout take the first exit onto Plessey Road and the ground is on the left up the lane just before Ginos bar.

South

Take the A1 and take the sign for (signs for Darlington/ Newcastle/ Airport) Slight right onto A194 (M) (signs for South Shields) At the roundabout, take the second exit onto Leam Lane/A194 and at the second roundabout take the second exit onto the A19 ramp to Morpeth/Tyne Tunnel merge onto the A19.

Go through the Tyne Tunnel, take the A19 Signposted Morpeth, and then at second roundabout take the A189 Signposted Ashington. Then after 6 ½ mile at the roundabout, take the fifth exit onto A189.

Take the exit toward A192/ Seaton/ Delaval/ Cramlington then merge onto the A1061, at first roundabout follow signs A1061 to Blyth. Go straight across next two roundabouts following Town Centre/ South Beach then at next roundabout turn left onto Rotary Way go straight across next roundabout, and at the next turn right into Plessey Road and the ground is situated on your left with entrance to the ground at the bus stop just before Gino fish and chip shop and its street parking in the area.

Train to **Newcastle Central Railway Station** then take the metro to the City Centre **Haymarket Metro Station** then walk over to Haymarket Bus Station and take the **Max X7, X18 Sapphire X21 or X22** from Stand V to Blyth get off at South Beach Amersham Drive then walk down to the roundabout turn left on to Rotary Road then at the next roundabout take a left into Plessey Road and walk up to Ginos and then take the lane to the ground.



Train to **Newcastle Central Railway Station** then take the GRN metro service to **Regent Metro Station** then walk over to Stand B and take the **Max X9, 10, 11** busses to Plessey Road on Eleventh Avenue then it's a straight 400 yard walk to Ginos then turn left up the lane for the ground.

Ground Guide

Originally called Shodfriars Lane, in 1893 and was taken over from the defunct Boston Athletic in 1933 by United. The ground has a capacity for 6,645 of which over the ground has two stands which can accommodate 1,323 seats in both stands both other ends behind the goal are covered and the pilgrims have a good club shop. The Fantasy Island Stand is situated to the north of the pitch and has an all seated capacity of 1,323. It also holds the Directors' seating and dugouts and as the Ground is A grade ground all games are segregated.



The Benton Brothers York Street Stand is situated to the east of the pitch. The right-hand side of this stand is reserved for away supporters, who are accommodated by flat terracing as well as the benches above and it is an unusual stand with both terracing near the pitch and seating above and behind. Its capacity is 1,435 with 503 seated. The players' changing rooms, tunnel, boardroom, medical centre and press box are housed here.

The Spayne Road Terrace is situated to the south of the pitch and it is a low terrace running the full length of the pitch with a capacity of 2,064. The Town End Terrace is situated to the west of the pitch. Formerly reserved for away fans, it is now allocated as a home stand and it has a maximum capacity of 1,821.

Travel down the A1 and take the A46/A17 exit toward Sleaford/ Newark/ Lincoln and continue down the A17 to just before Swineshead Railway Station there take a left on to the A1121, go through one roundabout take a left at the next roundabout onto Sleaford Road then follow the road right at the Eagle Public House then at the roundabout take a left on to John Adams Way then after crossing the bridge turn right at traffic lights into Main Ridge East, then right again into York Street (Opposite Eagle Fisheries) and the ground is down on the right.

South



Take the M25 to Junction 21A, take the A405 exit to St. Albans/ London (N.W)/ M1 South, At the roundabout, take the 1st exit onto North Orbital Rd/A405 go straight on at two roundabouts then at the next take the 3rd exit onto North Orbital Rd/ A414 and at the second roundabout take the 2nd exit onto the A1 (M1) ramp to A414/ Hertford/ Stevenage.

Then Continue onto A1 (M) (signs for The North/Peterborough) then at junction 17, exit onto Fletton Parkway/A1139 toward Wisbech then at the roundabout, take the first exit onto Paston Parkway/ A15 then take the A47 ramp to A1/Leicester.

Then at the roundabout, take the third exit onto Eye Rd/ A47 at the roundabout, take the first exit onto A16 then at the fourth roundabout take the third exit and stay on A16 and follow the road into Boston then at the roundabout take a right on to John Adams Way after crossing the bridge then turn right at traffic lights into Main Ridge East, then right again into York Street (Opposite Eagle Fisheries) and the ground is down on the right.

Take the M6 to Junction 30, then exit onto M61 toward Manchester/ Bolton/ Leeds/ Blackburn/ M62/ M65 then drive for around twenty miles then keep right at the fork, follow signs for M60 and merge onto M60 At junction 1, take the A5145 exit to Stockport (West & Centre) then At the roundabout, take the second exit onto Travis Brow (A5145) then at the

next roundabout, take the 2nd exit onto Heaton Lane then two hundred yards turn right onto Wellington Road N/A6 and continue to follow A6

At the next roundabout just after New Mills take the second exit onto A5004 and keep on the road to Buxton, just past Cavendish Hospital in Buxton at the University take a left into Station Road and then second left at the roundabout into the Quadrant then fourth left into Hardwick Road and follow it to the end then turn left at the T Junction and the ground is 200 yards on the left.



South

Take the M6 to Junction 15 and take the A500 exit to Stoke-on-Trent/ Newcastle-under-Lyme then at the roundabout, take the second exit onto A500 then after four miles, take the A53 ramp to Leek, Hanley, Newcastle-Under-Lyme then take the fourth exit onto the A53. Stay on the A53 through three roundabouts and then take right just before Leek and follow the A53 into Buxton then from the University take a left into Station Road and then second left at the roundabout into the Quadrant then fourth left into Hardwick Road and follow it to the end then turn left at the T Junction and the ground is 200 yards on the left.

The ground has a capacity of 3,000 with the main stand having seating for 300 with three uncovered grass ends at each end and has a good club shop.

On one side in front of the Social Club building is a small seated area that is covered. It is only comprises four or five rows and has a number of supporting pillars running along its front.



It is situated to one side of the half way line, towards the Cricket Club End. There are also open standing areas to either side. The opposite side has no facilities for spectators, apart from a narrow pathway which runs along the perimeter fence. The team dugouts are located on this side of the ground. There is also a portakabin type building that sits astride the halfway line.



The Cricket Club End itself has a very small covered terrace which sits behind the goal. It is only a couple of rows high. To either side there are small flat standing areas. Opposite is the South Bank. This area was recently developed so that it has a covered seated stand behind the goal flanked by fair sized open terracing to either side. There is a noticeable slope to the pitch running from the Cricket End down to the South Bank.

From the M1 to Junction 15A and then take A43 from Northampton or Oxford, or M40 to Junction 11 then A422 from Banbury to large roundabout south of town. Take exit marked Brackley and follow towards the town (Tesco store on left). Pass the Locomotive public house and take first turning right, signposted Football Club, into Churchill Way the road leads into Club Car Park.

Take the M40 to junction 10, take the A43/B430 exit to Northampton/ Middleton/ Stoney At the roundabout, take the second exit onto A43 then at the sixth roundabout take the 2nd exit onto Oxford Rd continue through one roundabout and take first turning right, signposted Football Club, into Churchill Way the road leads into Club Car Park.

There former ground beside Bradford Cricket commonly known as the Doll House was my first ground as part of the old 88 in 1962 they moved to the Horsfall Stadium in 1994 after wandering around Bradford and Bramley for a ground between 1968 and 1994.



The ground has a capacity of 5,000 with the main stand having seating for 1,250 with three uncovered grass ends at each end and has a good club shop and the running track keeping you a distance from the game

Victory Park, a stadium with a capacity of 4,100, of which 900 are seating was constructed at a cost of £1,000, construction of Victory Park was completed in 1920 and was named to commemorate the end of the First World War The ground was very different to the Victory Park of today, as both ends of the ground were exposed to the weather and there was no concrete terracing. The grandstand was a modest wooden structure with accommodation for 600.

The Grandstand is almost the full length of the pitch which can accommodate 900 people behind each of the goals is covered terracing and opposite the main stand is open terracing.

The Tameside Stadium was officially opened by Sir Alex Ferguson in 2005 with The Main Stand sits astride the half way line and runs for about half the length of the pitch. Although in capacity is 524 seats, the stand itself looks a lot larger. This is firstly due to the fact that the seating area is raised above pitch level, meaning that spectators have to climb a small set of stairs to enter it.



Opposite the Main Stand is a good-sized covered terrace. It runs for around half the length of the pitch), has a high placed roof and has portions of open terracing to each side. Both ends have open terraces that although not that high and do run the full width of the end. The stadium has a set of four tall floodlights.



Outside the stadium there is a statue of three football players, who were born locally and played in the World Cup; Geoff Hurst (England), Jimmy Armfield (England) and Simone Perrotta (Italy).



The ground is overlooked on the North side, by a large pavilion looking building, which is two storeys high and has an old fashioned looking clock above it. This building as well as the one next to it, houses amongst other things the team changing rooms. To one side there is a block of covered seating, which is normally unused, and the team dugouts are situated in front of this area.



On the South side is a covered seated stand that runs for half the length of the pitch and is situated just off centre, compared to the halfway line with 588 seats. There are flat standing areas to either side of this stand. At the one end of the ground is a sizeable covered terrace, which is eight steps high and is affectionately called the 'Tin Shed' named after a similar structure that was in place at the former Feethams Ground having a capacity of 1,000, the new Tin Shed runs the full width of the pitch.

Opposite is the open West Terrace, which when segregation is in force, is given to away fans. The ground is completed with a set of eight modern looking floodlights, four of which run down each side of the stadium.

On one side is the Main Stand. This small, tidy looking stand which runs half the length of the pitch. It straddles the half way line but is off centre from it. The stand is all seated and covered. There are no obstructing pillars and the floodlights pylons on that side are considerably located at the back and to either side of the stand. Next to the Main Stand on one side, is the teams' dressing rooms to which there is a staircase that leads up to them.



Main Stand

Opposite on the North side of the ground is a small open terrace and in front are located the team dugouts. As the dressing rooms are on the other side of the ground, then this results in a procession of club personnel across the pitch.



The West End, also known as the Shed End, is a strange old-fashioned looking affair, having a small cover with a large number of supporting pillars running along the front of the six-step high terrace and it is also set back from the pitch and halfway along there is a large dividing fence and gate, which allows this end to be split between home and away fans if needed. The other end is a simple open flat standing area.

The Merton Stand, on the eastern side of the ground is the only all-seater stand in the ground and was built in 1968. It currently has a capacity of 1818. Initially it was flanked on either side by standing areas known as the *Cowsheds*, but when the club progressed into the Football League the stand was extended to cover the entire length of the pitch. The Merton Stand is the nominated family stand and includes the director's and press boxes, with matchday sponsors also seated in this stand. In front of the stand lie the dugouts next to the players' tunnel. All of the club facilities, such as offices, changing rooms, boardroom and corporate hospitality are located underneath the stand. The result of this is a number of windows at pitch level.




The Meadow End is located at the northern end of the ground and is traditionally populated with the club's most vocal supporters. It is a fully covered terrace and has a distinctive curve to its shape. The flat area in front of the terracing enables supporters to stand directly behind the perimeter wall of the pitch, very close to the action. It has a capacity of 1,500. Located behind this end is the substantial Merton Meadow car park.



Edgar Street Stand

The pitch's distinctive downhill slope is in the direction of the Meadow End, which has seen some memorable goals over the years, most notably the goals scored by Ronnie Radford and Ricky George in the 1972 FA Cup victory over Newcastle United.

The Len Weston Stand on the western side of the ground is a narrow two-tiered stand and was built in 1974, replacing the previous wooden grandstand, which was moved to a field near Risbury in the County. The stand has a total capacity of 1996, comprising 936 seats and a further 1060 standing. It extends the entire length of the pitch and was named after the former president and benefactor of the club, Len Weston and the stand is now sponsored by Weston's Cider.



The Meadow End

The stand is unusual in that the lower tier is terraced and the upper tier seated. The upper tier contains just five steep rows of seating but offers perhaps the best view in the ground as it is higher than the Merton Stand and also closer to the pitch so supporters may not be able to see the front of the pitch, but seating is narrow.

The view from the terracing on the lower tier can be obscured by a number of supporting pillars, but also has the benefit of being very close to the touchline. The proximity of the A49 road immediately behind the stand limited the amount of room to build, hence the relatively small number of rows of seating. Ticket allocation is split between home and away supporters with the Meadow End side allocated to home supporters.



Merton Meadow Family Stand

The Blackfriars End terrace situated to the behind the southern goal, the stand was split between home supporters to the east, and away supporters to the west. The club parade the only live mascot a Hereford bull before the game.

The ground is beside the Severn Valley Railway and on one side is the East Stand, this single tiered, cantilevered stand, replaced a former terrace with Perspex panels have been incorporated into the front of its roof allowing sunlight to reach the pitch.



On one side is the Reynolds (Main Stand) Stand which is a single tiered stand, although it comprises just eight rows of seats, it appears much larger as it has quite a tall back wall at the back of the stand, the middle portion of which houses a glassed fronted executive area.



Part of the East Stand is given to away supporters where around 1,500 supporters can be accommodated. In addition a number of seats are also made available in the Bill Greaves East Stand with both North and South ends are small covered terraces.

King & Castle located on the Station Approach on Comberton Hill inside the Severn Valley Railway Station which is next to Kidderminster mainline railway station. I have been visiting this establishment since 1989 and it has always been a fascination to me. The place is designed to be part of the Severn Valley Railway experience, so just like the station and locomotives are a throwback to the 1940's so is this pub. During the daytime, there is a restaurant just off the bar, but during the evenings it is just crisps, nuts and cobs and of

course REAL ALE but no TV, jukebox or fruit machine.

Generally, there are about 5 cask ales and a couple of keg beers, for those without the sophisticated palate, available with Bathams being a regular product; local ciders are also available. Across the road from station is another pub called the Railway Bell still on Comberton Hill, plus Fish & chips place called 'Captain Cod'.

Coming out of the railway station and passing the Severn Valley Railway Station on the left and a little further down the hill on the same side is the recently opened Weavers Real Ale House this small pub specialises in real ale and it serves cider and wine. The service is welcoming and there's always something different to try as the owners bring in different tipples from all over the country including their own microbrewery ale.

The Grandstand all although it only runs for around 2/3rds of the length of the pitch, straddling the halfway line, it is of a good size and looks quite imposing. This covered stand has a single tier of 1,200 seats, which are raised above pitch level, meaning that you have to climb a small set of stairs to enter it. The stand contains the club facilities, such as the dressing rooms, press area clubhouse bar, cafe and club shop



Opposite is a small covered terrace that runs for the entire length of the pitch. Although it has a number of supporting pillars running along the front and along the middle, it is around 12 steps high. Both ends are open to the elements and are small terraces. The larger of these is at the West end of the stadium. Called the Tennyson Road End, it has a few elevated steps of the terrace

The club moved from the Old windmill Ground to the New Ground in 2000 the New Windmill is just over a Mile from the old ground in Tachbrook Rd, Leamington Spa. At the Harbury Lane End of the ground is where the Club house and main entrance are situated it is a small covered terrace. It runs for around half the width of the pitch and sits directly behind the goal. On one side is a flat standing area; whilst on the other side is a portakabin type structure that serves as a corporate facility. Opposite is the North Bank, a large open terrace.



Harbury Road End

On the West side is the Main Stand which is all seated stand, has four rows of seats and runs for around about near length of the pitch. Although there are no supporting pillars, there are the bases of two of the floodlight pylons in front which could obstruct your view to which the seating is split into three sections, although the roof is continuous. On one side of this stand towards the North Bank there is a small portion of open terrace with a programme shop.

Opposite the East Side is mostly open with small flat standing areas running behind its perimeter. It did at one time have a small seated stand that straddled the half way line, but in 2013 this was moved to the other side of the ground, to expand the seating area on that side. Towards the Harbury Lane End there is a small temporary bank of seating. Also on this side are the team dugouts. The West side itself is made up of open terrace and then whilst in the North East corner of the stadium there is a small electric scoreboard.

This ground is an older style of ground, with the ground capacity is 8,840. There are two stands which hold 790 & 236, uncovered terraces behind each goal and covered terracing everywhere else. Away fans generally stand at the Bristol End (the West end) and if there is segregation they get that area and the smaller stand. There's a club shop with a massive collection of programmes for the enthusiast and all the souvenirs you wish to take away with you.



Driving to the Ground

North 

Take the M5 to junction 15, exit onto M4 toward London/ M32/ Bristol, then at junction 19 of the M4 and merge on to the M32 and take the first exit onto the Bristol Ring Road, A4174, going left signposted towards Bath. Follow this road and the signs to Bath until you join the A4 at Keynsham, again signposted Bath.

Follow this through Salford and continue on the A4 down Lower Bristol Road Turn right at the next set of lights under the Railway Bridge (Cars Only) in Connection Road onto the High Street just past the Shops take a right at blockbusters and Twerton Park is on your left and there are good spaces for cars

South West

Take the M4 to Junction 19 and merge onto the M32 and follow the directions above.

South East

Take the M4 to Junction 18 and at the roundabout take the first exit onto the A46 and after three miles take the third exit at the roundabout onto the A420 then after a mile turn left into Freezeinghill Lane after three miles take a right at the sign for Weston into Lansdown Lane and continue to the church roundabout where you take the first left into High Street.

Quag End

The ground is surrounded by trees and a 4,000 capacity the main stand this runs for around half the length of the pitch and it contains 550 seats and has open terracing to either side. Like stands of its age have a number of supporting pillars running along its front. Opposite the main stand is the Crossing Road Terrace. This small covered terrace has the team dugouts located in front. Both ends are fairly new terraces, the most recent of which the Quag End was replaced in 2012. Both ends are uncovered and the smaller Social Club End, which can accommodate both home and away fans.



The Main Stand

Opposite is the Crossing Road Terrace. In a former life the framework for this stand was the old Main Stand at Bedworth United. This pitch roofed covered terrace has the dugouts located in front. A total of 1,130 can be catered for on this side, with 755 of them under the cover.

Both ends are uncovered and the Clubhouse End (capacity 1,131), is split into two blocks of terracing with a gap in the middle that leads to the bar, main exit and excellent supporters club shop (an Aladdin's Cave of programmes, badges, and ephemera).

The ground can hold a capacity of 3,065 with 1,311 seated around the ground there is one large main stand, with a few rows of terracing at the front, a few rows of seats on the far side of the ground and then temporary terracing (around 4 steps worth) behind each goal.



Driving to the Ground



From Junction 28 of the M25 join the A12 sign-posted Chelmsford. After approximately nine miles take the exit sign-posted Chelmsford/Harlow. You then join another dual carriageway

then continue along this road (for approximately two miles) until you reach the first of two roundabouts. You then go straight across the first roundabout (note at this roundabout anyone driving in on the A414 will join).

The A414 should turn left at this point and drive up to the second roundabout. At the second roundabout you take the first left, signposted Chelmsford Crematorium/ Widford Industrial Area, you keep straight on this road, following the signs for the Town Centre and Hospital A & E. Along this road you will notice a Nissan Garage on your right and later a Fire Station, also on your right. After passing the Fire Station you will reach the final set of lights on this road. Keep left as you approach these lights.



As you go through the lights keep left and enter the slip road. Ahead is a road signposted A1060 Sawbridgeworth. Take the A1060 turning and stay on this road, through first set of lights. At second set of lights go into the right-hand filter lane and turn right. This takes you into Chignall Road. Stay on this road for a short while before turning right into Melbourne Avenue. Ahead you will see a tall block of flats, turn left immediately in front of them into Salerno Way. The entrance to the Stadium is via a left turn at the next mini-roundabout.

The Stadium ground has been upgraded over the last few years plus the car park has been repaired. Inside the ground has two stands with the main stand has a few rows of seats and has a bar behind, with the entrance and exit via the old tunnel. The view is obstructed by pillars and also sits bizarrely some 5 metres behind the touchline, whilst either side of it the perimeter fence sits on the touchline. On the opposite side is a small stand again sat back from the touchline and around the rest of the stadium is simple standing behind the barrier.

The ground has been well designed and comfortable with a capacity of 4,100 as well as being probably the most environmentally friendly football ground so far constructed in the UK. The main stand has just three rows, seating in total for 640 spectators and a glassed area at the rear, which contains the clubhouse bar. Like the rest of the stadium, the roof is situated quite high above the spectator area and has a slight oval angle to it. The other three sides of the stadium are small terraced areas.



Opposite the Main Stand the Wooden Man sculpture stands on the terrace, if segregation is in force then away fans are housed in the Car Park End which has a capacity of 700 supporters and in addition 38 seats are made available on one side of the Main Stand by the Car Park End.

from the North take Junction 6A on to the M25 After going over the Dartford Crossing (which costs £2), leave the motorway at Junction 1b and take the left hand slip road for A225 Dartford. The Crabble Athletic Ground, commonly known simply as “Crabble” or “The Crabble” forms part of a larger council-owned complex, the ground has a capacity of 6,500 with 1000 seats the seats are divided between the Main Stand which runs the length of the ground and opposite in the right hand corner is the Family Stand and on this side of the ground has a bit of non-cover and also the small Crewe Spot enclosure, running both widths of the pitch are the Dover End and the River End both full covered standing enclosures behind each goal.

Driving to the Ground



Take the M25, on then to the M2/A2 (following the signs to Canterbury, and then from Canterbury follow signs to Dover) as far as the Whitfield roundabout (there is a McDonald's Drive-Thru on the left). Take the fourth exit at this roundabout, down Whitfield Hill. At the bottom of the hill turn left at the roundabout and follow this road until the first set of traffic lights. At the lights turn right (180 degrees down the hill) and follow the road under the railway bridge, the ground is a little further up the road on the left. There is no parking for supporters within the ground, although parking is available in the rugby ground, which is just inside the main entrance - stewards will direct you.

The Tommy Jover Main Stand even though it has been built onto the front of an office building which is all seated stand is elevated, that you have to climb a small set of stairs to enter it. Once there you are rewarded with excellent views of the pitch as there are no supporting pillars to contend and the stand that contains the Social Club. The area is covered and the roof has a gable on top which includes a clock. DHFC is proudly emblazoned below it.

The Champion Hill ground is largely open and has mostly flat standing areas on three sides, with just a small portion (a few steps high) of terracing towards the rear. Both the East and West ends



are uncovered, as well as most of the Southside, although this does have a small portion of cover and terrace located at its centre.

Although the ground is one of the more basic in the South with a capacity of 4,151, on one side is the smart looking Main Stand. This stand has a capacity of 542 seats. The stand runs for about half the length of the pitch and strangely has been built mostly to one side of the half way line.



Opposite is and a small covered terrace, called the Peter Fountain Stand, that extends again for around half the length of the pitch. In one corner this meets the River End Terrace, which is covered. The opposite end, the Mick Green Stand, is a small covered area which is divided into two. The team entrance from the dressing rooms to the ground runs out from this end and above this stand is one of the two club houses.



Driving to the Ground

The ground has a capacity for 4,200 supporters new stand which was opened in November 2017, runs the full length of the pitch. It is unusual looking in that the roof is situated quite high above the seating area, with a tall back wall. The Main Stand roof also curves upwards in the middle over the halfway line. It has a capacity of 1,016 seats.



Swanscombe End

On the opposite side of the ground the wooden Main Stand and this single tiered covered stand, is all seated and runs for around half the length of the pitch. This stand has a fair number of supporting pillars running along the front of it, although the seating is raised above pitch level with a small terrace in front of this stand.



Main Stand

At one end is a covered stand, known as the Plough End, gaining its name from the former pub that was situated just behind it and the former covered terrace, which has since had 534 seats installed.



New Stand

The opposite end, known as the Swanscombe End, is an open terrace, which is dominated by a huge electricity pylon which sits directly behind it. In 2018 this had a number safety crush barriers installed as well as an electric scoreboard at its rear.

Cherrywood Road has a capacity of 6,000, for just now but with a lot of construction this will increase. The Moor Road End turnstiles are to the left of the main stand and a brand new stand at the Prospect Road End with a capacity of 1,300

On the Main Stand side you have a small open terrace near the turnstiles and club shop, this leads to the front of the main stand, which has seating for 700 people. The other side of the Main Stand is another small terrace called the Chairman's Mound traditional home fans.

The Moor Road End terrace is for away supporters (during segregated matches) and is covered with a capacity of 1,980 and The Electronic scoreboard is above it, the East Stand is completely cover with 1064 seats and a family enclosure.

The Beveree Stadium is on the small sidewell maintained and has real wooded feel to it, with a lot of large trees being visible around its perimeter. On the west side of the ground, there is a mixture of stands. In the centre is the very small Main Stand that has 234 seats. It has three large supporting pillars along its front. An additional row of seats have been attached to the front wall at pitch level (included in the number above). Attached to the Main Stand in

the south east corner is a shallow terrace, which has seven wide steps, and has a corrugated roof that covers most of the area. Again it has a number of supports running across its middle.



Main Stand

On the other side of the Main Stand is a small covered seated stand, with 251 seats. Although it is temporary in nature, it looks as though it has been there for some time as the green seats look faded and some of the seats are not in the best condition! The corrugated iron roof only covers the back few rows of seats and there are also some standing areas on this side of the pitch.

Driving to the Ground



From the M25 exit Junction 12 and go round the roundabout and take the third exit onto the M3 Junction and come off at Junction 1 (Sunbury) follow signs for A308 Kingston (third exit) and from the North take Junction 13 of the M25 take the first exit onto Staines By-Pass/A30 go through one roundabout.

Then for both routes follow the road past Kempton Park race course. After approximately 2 miles turn left into High Street at the Indian cuisine, then immediately left into Station Road. The entrance to Beveree is in Beaver Close, which is 200 yards on the right and there is street parking further up the High Street.

Bulpit Lane has seen some improvements recently with the installation of a covered seated stand at the North End of the ground. This stand which was acquired from Newbury FC contains 210 seats in seven rows. It runs for around a third of the length of the pitch and is situated directly behind the goal. Either side of this stand are newish concreted, slightly raised single steps.



The rest of the ground is a rather disjointed being made up of several small stands plus a number of uncovered standing areas. The ground is small and functional but with few features of note other than the turnstiles and HTFC spelt out on the entrance gates.

The East side of the ground backs onto the ancient and very delightful Hungerford Common, this side looks similar to the West having a small covered seated stand with 176 seats straddling the halfway line. There are 7 pillars that get in the way.

To the North and South ends of the East side a single one step concrete standing area has been constructed. A new small covered seated stand has been installed to the south of the East (Main) Stand. Although it comprises only four rows containing around 100 seats, it is raised above pitch level, although there are some safety railings in front.

Clarence Park which has been opened since 1894 and backs on a beautiful cricket ground has a small stand with few rows but has the capacity of 667 and beside is the Boardroom with the club shop at the corner of the York Street end.

Across from the main Stand is the Cricket End enclosure with the York road and Hatfield Road End small uncovered at the back of the goals. At the back of the main Stand is the Saints Bar. The club has put in plans to move 100 yards to The City of St Albans Stadium

Come off A1 (M) at junction 3 onto A414 to St Albans. At next major roundabout take A1081 exit to St Albans. Follow road for approx 1 mile until mini roundabout (Great Northern pub on left). Go straight across into Clarence Road, the ground is first on left about 50 yards past junction or take the next turning on the left into York Road; ground entrance is at the end of the road on the left.

Arbour Park is a little different, mainly down to the smart looking Main Stand on one side of the pitch. From the outside, this stand that runs around half the length of the pitch and sits astride the halfway line is particularly eye-catching with a central column flanked by two semi-circular metal facades. The curves continue over the roof, extending over the 250 seats below. This seating area is comprised of eight rows. With no supporting pillars to contend with and with the rake of the stand being quite steep



Opposite the Main Stand is the East Stand. This small covered all seated stand is four rows high and runs for around a third of the length of the pitch, on the halfway line. It has a small curved roof. Both ends have small covered terraces that more or less extend the full width of the pitch.

From the M4 take exit at Junction 6 and then head towards Slough on the A355, go straight through roundabout until you reach main set of lights. (A4) then turn right and head east towards Slough Town Centre on the A4 for approx. two miles. At main set of lights turn left onto B416 signposted for slough cemetery & crematorium then follow this road you will go through several sets of lights an Arbour Park will be on your right.



From the M40 exit at Junction 2 and follow the A355 towards Slough and then take a left turn onto Parish Lane at The Indian Courtyard Restaurant and follow this road until it ends, turn right onto Windsor Road (B416) and follow this road until you reach a mini roundabout, take the second exit towards Slough Cemetery & Crematorium with Arbour Park will be on your left.



The clubhouse can be found to the right of the main entrance, looking out towards the pitch, albeit at ground level and a little way from the action. The ground has a capacity of 2,500 with 700 seats around the ground



For the time being there is no cover on the near side of the ground, except for the Directors' Stand which is a real gem. It may in the future become a casualty of any building that takes place although we can but hope that the club will do what it did with the stand when they moved back in the 1980's and re-erect it elsewhere in the ground. Previously there were some rather precarious railway sleepers on this side, providing a slightly elevated but were replaced by two identical "Mezzanine" stands, erected in 2000/01 season.

Driving to the Ground



Take the M25 clockwise and at junction 5 keep on the right fork, onto the Sevenoaks Bypass/A21 toward Sevenoaks/Hastings and follow the A21 and exit for the B245 through Hildenborough towards Tonbridge (Tonbridge is not signposted at this junction) so at the roundabout, take the second exit onto London Road and continue down this road for around 4 miles. At the T Junction just past the Langley Hotel take a left turn into Dry Hill Park Road, after another 400 yards, go left at the mini-roundabout, then at the next roundabout, by the 'Pinnacles' Pub turn left again and follow Darenth Avenue to the bottom of the hill, and the car park.

Park View Road, home of Welling United FC and Erith & Belvedere FC. The Wings moved to Park View Road when a fire destroyed their ground in Eltham and they moved into the old Bexley United ground which had just gone defunct, unlike many ground sharing arrangements this is a permanent.



Main Stand, High Street End, East Stand

The sale of the Deres old ground of Park View provided funds to completely redevelop one side of Park View Road, where Erith's headquarters are now maintained, completely separate from those of Welling United.

Park View Road is one of those 'traditional' football grounds adjacent to the main high street, with a capacity of 4,000 with 1,070 seated around the ground. Erith's own new facilities adjacent to the main stand, replaced aging terracing that was partly covered by a rusting shelter supported by a fragile-looking arrangement of scaffolding poles. The Welling clubhouse is quite small and its entrance is immediately ahead of the turnstiles as you enter the ground.

The Main Stand was built in the late 1950 by the now defunct Bexley United and was extended in the 1960 and this has now been update to bring it up tot Conference stands in March 2014 which was nearly have them sent down to the Isthmian League if it hadn't been fixed.



East Stand

Opposite the Main Stand is the much newer East Stand which was opened in 2002. Also known as the Cricket Club side this stand is all covered and all seated. It has a capacity of 600. However, it only runs half the length of the pitch towards the Danson Park End and has a pair of pillars on either side which also serve as floodlight pylons. One of these could impede your view of the playing action down at the High Street End. At one side of the East Stand is the building which houses a social club and adjacent to this is a flat standing area. away fans are allocated the whole of the East Stand and the Danson Park Terrace. The terrace is open to the elements so if the weather forecast is not good, then use the East Stand, as they are under roof. There are 600 seats with around 400 standing places available on Danson Park End.

Both ends are open terraces. The larger of these is at the Danson Park End, which looks quite picturesque with a number of large trees behind it. Opposite is the smaller High Street End. This end is located very close to the main road and passengers on the upper deck of

passing buses can see into the ground as they pass the ground. There is some netting at the back of the terrace to help prevent balls being kicked over.

Driving to the Ground



Go on to the M25 then over the Queen Elizabeth Bridge, leave the M25 at junction 1b, take the A225 exit to Dartford, at the next roundabout, take the second exit and then at the next roundabout, take the third exit onto the A2 ramp to London/ Bexleyheath.

Then A2 towards London and take Bexleyheath/ Sidcup, turn off (five miles along the A2) and then take the A221/A210 exit toward Bexleyheath /Sidcup, at the roundabout, take the second exit onto Blendon Rd/A210 then at the next roundabout take the third exit onto Danson Underpass/ A221 and go straight on at one roundabout past Danson House and park and then at lights take a left and the ground is 200 yards on the left just past the cricket ground and parking is in the local street.

Take the train to **Welling Railway Station** and from the station, go down the slope to the road at the bottom and then turn left into Central Avenue and go to the end of the road, turn left onto Bellegrove Road. This becomes Welling High Street and then Park View Road and the ground is on the right just after the Guy, Earl of Warwick pub; it is a 15-20-minute walk. If you wish to go by **London bus**, numbers **89, 486 and B16** run past the ground from the station.

The Bob Lucas Stadium where there is cover on all four sides of the stadium. On the west side is the Main Grandstand, which is a covered seated stand that runs for around half the length of the pitch and sits astride the halfway line. The seating area of the stand is raised well above the level of the pitch, there a small staircase to access it. In front of this stand are the team dugouts.



Both ends are similar-sized covered terraces, whilst on the remaining side of the ground, there is a covered terrace, that runs for around half the length of the pitch. This area is called the Southill Terrace and is affectionately nicknamed the Babs Windsor stand by the Weymouth fans. The rest of the ground mostly comprises of portions of open terrace, to either side of the stands and in the corners, making the ground a good size in terms of capacity. The ground has a set of four tall great looking traditional floodlights.

Driving to the Ground



Take the A35 and A37 to Dorchester and from Dorchester at the Castle Park roundabout go on to the A354. Take the second exit at first roundabout onto Weymouth Relief Road, continue to the next roundabout then turn right. At the next roundabout take second exit and go straight on at the next roundabout then At the next roundabout take third exit (Signposted Football Ground) into Granby Way and at the next roundabout take the the third exit into Radipole Lane there is plenty of parking at the side of the ground just of the lane.

Train to **Weymouth Railway Station** head out of the station and turn right down King Street. Cross over and turn left at the roundabout. The Bus Stop is located next to the roundabout in front of the Bus Garage. Both routes go via the Town Centre and pick up at Commercial Road (behind Debenhams) and Town Bridge at the harbour end of St Thomas Street. Both buses can be caught from King Street Roundabout just a few minutes from the station the following First Bus Routes.

The No. 5 Radipole and this route gets you closest to the ground and has a 40 minute frequency in the day time, but nothing in the evening. Ask the driver for Chafeys Avenue which is just a 2 minute walk from the Wessex Stadium.

The No. 3 for Hereford Road and this route has a 10 minutes frequency during the day and half hourly during the evening. Ask for Radipole Lane which is a 6 minutes stroll along Radipole Lane to the Wessex Stadium.

Driving to the Ground



From the M25 leave the motorway at Junction 9 and at the roundabout take the third exit onto the A243 go straight on at the next roundabout and then at the next roundabout take the second exit onto the Leatherhead By-pass/A24 and taking the second exit at the next roundabout keeping on the A24 then at the next roundabout take the first exit and follow the road all the way to Worthing. Follow the A24 past the Black Horse pub on your left and keep driving past the Jet petrol station (on your left) then at the roundabout, take the second exit into Offington Lane. (This is a 30mph road) and carry on driving south. Continue to go straight on through the traffic lights at the Thomas a' Beckett pub (on the left corner).

Follow the road round and go straight on at the first mini-roundabout and about 100 yards along you'll see another mini-roundabout, take the first exit into Saint Lawrence Avenue. There's another mini-roundabout which you should go straight across then after 150 yards along there's another mini-roundabout, then take the third exit down Nutbourne Road and continue going straight to the next junction.

Take a left down Bulkington Road and Woodside Road will be third right in about 250 yards although now would be a good time to park your car as Woodside Road itself gets very busy on match days. This being a residential area, where parking is tight it is best on match days to drive or park down Woodside Road is not advisable. Try the roads situated around the ground like Bulkington Avenue, Nutbourne Road, Shermanbury Road, Gaisford Road, Woodmancote Road and Henty Road although this will get busy.

Train to **Worthing Central Railway Station**. When you come out of the station, take an immediate right and walk parallel to the train-line down Cross Street. About 100 meters down the road, you will see a train crossing and then turn right here into South Farm Road.

Take the next left down Pavilion Road and walk along here for about 400 meters where you should start to be able to see the floodlights and then you will see Woodside Road on the right and the ground is about another 200 yards on the left.
